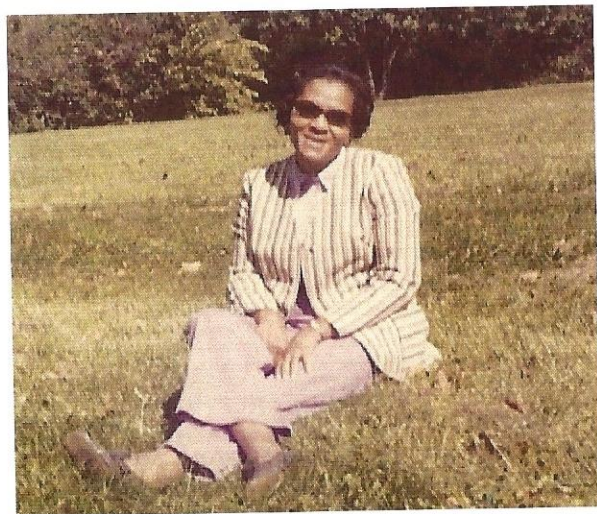


I'll Be Seeing You
