





At an early age Mother Norton stood her ground. She was small in statue under her own umbrella of flowering independence. Frances had a motto "Whatever Your Hands Find to Do-Do It" Of course she was a great example of this motto.

Frances was also a great cook! Often during her fund-raising dinners customers would inquire "Where is your restaurant located?" She would smile out loud that her kitchen was at home and she did not have a restaurant. Her husband often teased that she cooked as if she was cooking for an army.

Frances had a sense of humor. She never wanted to be married to a preacher. Once in love and super sizing her small frame to looking like her girls' mother and not their sister, she fell in line with being a mother and wife embracing and loving to serve both at home and church. She would often remind you," When God called my husband, he called me as well into the ministry.
